Your child's school is a member of the West Horsham Schools Network, which is made up of 10 schools in the West Horsham locality. Headteachers from all 10 schools have a shared moral purpose to work together to improve the learning, achievement, outcomes and curriculum for all of the young people in their schools. We firmly believe that we are "stronger together" and that partnership and collaboration between teachers in different schools is an effective way to continually develop and improve teaching and learning for the benefit of students, parents and the communities in which we work.

The network support one another by working together in various groups.

- Headteachers meet each half-term to share best practice, working together strategically to enable all children in West Horsham to achieve their very best and currently trying to make financial savings by sharing resources.
- We employ a Primary Mental Health Worker to build the capacity of our schools to effectively support our young people with emotional and mental health issues.
- Our Early Years Leaders meet each half-term to share best practice, to provide opportunities for teachers to moderate EYFS work, to discuss the EYFS curriculum and to provide a 'Get Ready for School' booklet for all families starting in all schools.
- PSHE Leaders meet each half-term to ensure all children understand their role in The World as global citizens, to provide opportunities for teachers to improve the teaching of GC in their schools and all schools fulfill their role in supporting communities less fortunate than their own through the Kiva and Save the Children projects.
- SENCOs meet regularly to work collaboratively and share best practice, to share specialised CPD for SENCOS and staff in schools for children of SEN with the aim of ensuring all SEN children are offered the best possible opportunities.
- Staff are able to access high quality coaching through trained teacher coaches in the network to embed teaching and learning within all of our schools.
- Maths and English leaders meet regularly to share best practice, discuss curriculum challenges and to share CPD across the schools to ensure all children make good progress across the various age ranges.
- Schools share INSET days where key speakers are invited.
- Shared Bursar meetings, to share knowledge on financial and procurement matters, policies and procedures.
- Joint locality moderation mornings and sharing of expertise and resources across the network.
- Schools work together to improve transition across all key stages by offering taster days, gifted and able days, ambassador days and many more opportunities for our young people.
- Schools work closely together to support all pupils and ensure that our vulnerable children make good progress.
